Campaign Passes \$7 million As Focus Changes

Pledges to “The Strength of Tradition . . . The Pursuit of Excellence” capital campaign have passed \$7 million. We are grateful to those who have already made a pledge to the campaign and look forward to continued support from those who are to be approached in the coming months.

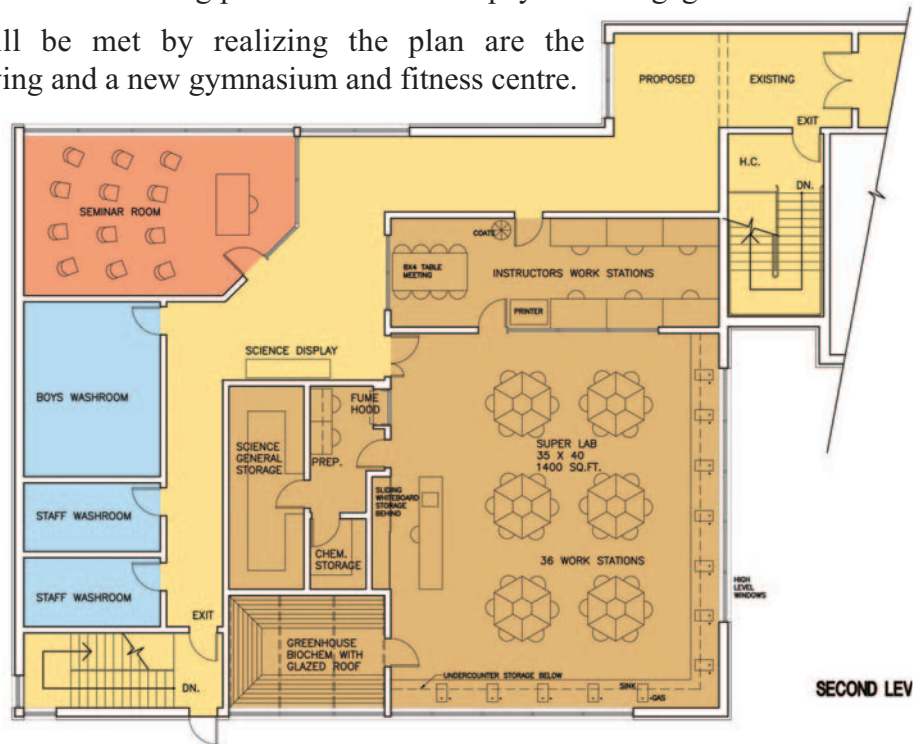
Successful fund raising and the restructuring of the long term debt incurred during the legal battles have enabled Vancouver College to advance to the next stage of “The Strength of Tradition . . . The Pursuit of Excellence” capital campaign, which is to implement the long range Vancouver College Site and Building Improvement Plan.

The goal for the campaign is \$10 million with a \$15 million challenge goal. Plans are to implement the building plan and pay the mortgage with pledges and by spending 50 cents of every dollar raised for the site and building plan and 50 cents to pay the mortgage.

Academic needs that will be met by realizing the plan are the construction of a science wing and a new gymnasium and fitness centre.

Concept drawings have been developed for the science wing that would include a super science laboratory, four classrooms and lecture theatre with performing arts capability. The building will be built on the southeast corner of Blessed Edmund Rice Hall. The cost estimate for the science wing is \$3 million.

A new gymnasium and fitness centre will also cost about \$3 million. The building will be constructed adjacent to the south wall of the current Alumni Gym and to the rear of the stands at O’Hagan Field.



Other components of the long range plan include:

- The restoration of the historic McCormack Hall
- Enlargement of the cafeteria area, and
- A new school chapel to be located in a prominent position on campus

Work is progressing on the Site and Building Plan. Our architects are in the process of developing detailed drawings and confirming respective costs. Strategies for public consultation and civic approvals are being developed by the Building Site Team headed by the architectural firm of Downs / Archambault & Partners.

Financial Report

The school's 2004 financial results reflected an improved year over year picture with bank debt being paid down, the extraordinary legal fee costs behind us and a return to an operating surplus. Revenue benefited from an increase in enrollment which is at capacity for all but the most senior grades and should be at capacity for all grades by Fiscal 2006. Subsequent to the fiscal year end, Vancouver College was able to restructure its debt, negotiating a favourable long term mortgage arrangement with its bankers by fixing the rates of interest for a large portion of the debt for terms of three and five years. The reduction of the amount of mortgage outstanding remains a priority and these funds will be sourced from the Capital Campaign.

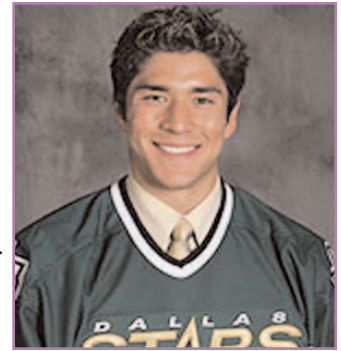
Tuition at Vancouver College – 1940

In 1940 senior day students at Vancouver College paid annual tuition of \$80. This jumped to \$380 for senior students who also boarded at the school. Resident students who wished to remain at the school during holiday periods were charged \$30 a month for room and board.



Irish Grad Selected in National Hockey League Draft

Raymond Sawada (VC'03) was selected by the Dallas Stars in the second round of the National Hockey League Draft in June this year. He was selected 52nd overall in the draft. Prior to the draft he had been playing for the Nanaimo Clippers of the British Columbia Hockey League at the Junior level. He is a power forward who scored 10 goals with 32 assists in 54 games last season with the Clippers. Prior to commencing a career in professional hockey he will be attending Cornell University and playing hockey for the Big Red. Raymond was an excellent track athlete at VC, winning a Silver Medal in the pole vault in the BC High School Track & Field Championships in his senior year. He is the son of Jack and Regina Sawada of Richmond and his twin brother, Stephen, also graduated from Vancouver College in 2003.



Initial Summer Camp Program a Success

Under the leadership of Vancouver College Principal, David Hardy, the school embarked upon a six week summer camp program, A Finnegan Summer, open to either male or female students who would be going into Grades 1 through 12. The camp offered a wide variety of activities including preparation courses in Mathematics and English. A combination of academic and recreational camps were held for students in Elementary and Middle schools including Public Speaking and Debate, Visual Arts, Computer 3-D camp, football and basketball skills and fresh water fishing.

Over 240 camp positions were filled with over 200 students attending. The camp instructors were all Vancouver College teachers, many of whom donated their time as a contribution to the Capital Campaign. This will become an annual event at the school with the camp offerings for 2005 available in the new year.

2003-04 VC Academic Results are Outstanding

In our Spring 2004 edition of the Irish Review we reported that the Class of 2003 enjoyed the best academic results in the school's history. We are now pleased to report to you the Class of 2004 (based upon the June, 2004 Provincial Examination results only – some of the students write some of the exams in January and April) outdid their schoolmates from the previous year. We anticipate when the final results (including the January and April Provincial Exams) are received at the beginning of November, the results will be even more positive. By way of example, the average Vancouver College mark in English 12 (an examination all VC seniors write) on the Provincial Exam was 81.2%, which was almost 10% higher than all other Independent schools and 13.5% better than the province as a whole.

A similar pattern was seen in Biology 12, Physics 12, Chemistry 12, History 12 and Mathematics 12 provincial results. Of our graduating class of 117 young men, 81 graduated with Honours status as determined by the provincial Ministry of Education. We are particularly proud to report one of our graduates, Jamie Bull, placed 6th overall in the province in provincial examination marks, scoring a perfect 100% in two subjects and 99% on the other. In addition to his scholastic success, Jamie was also a member of the Varsity football and basketball teams and a member of the Student Council.

Christian Brothers Reorganization

The Christian Brothers in North America, encompassing the three existing provinces of Canada, Eastern US and Western US, gathered in Cornwall, Ontario during the summer and in a formal declaration dated July 16, 2004 agreed to unite for mission in North America. Each of the three former provinces will appoint three Brothers to serve on the Leadership Team. The new North American Leadership Team will choose a new Province Leader and then determine the site of the new headquarters for the combined entity. We pray for God's blessing on the community of Christian Brothers as they continue the ministry of Blessed Edmund Rice in North America.

Cadet Corps at Vancouver College

In April 1940, Vancouver College organized at the request of the Department of National Defense, its first Cadet Corps. Under the leadership of Major Norman Burley, a Seaforths Officer and Royal Military College graduate, cadets were given instruction in drill, signaling, first aid, field work and the use of a rifle. The Corps ranks quickly swelled to over 100 and the boys were under the command of Cadet Major Bill O'Neill (VC'40) who was also the school president.

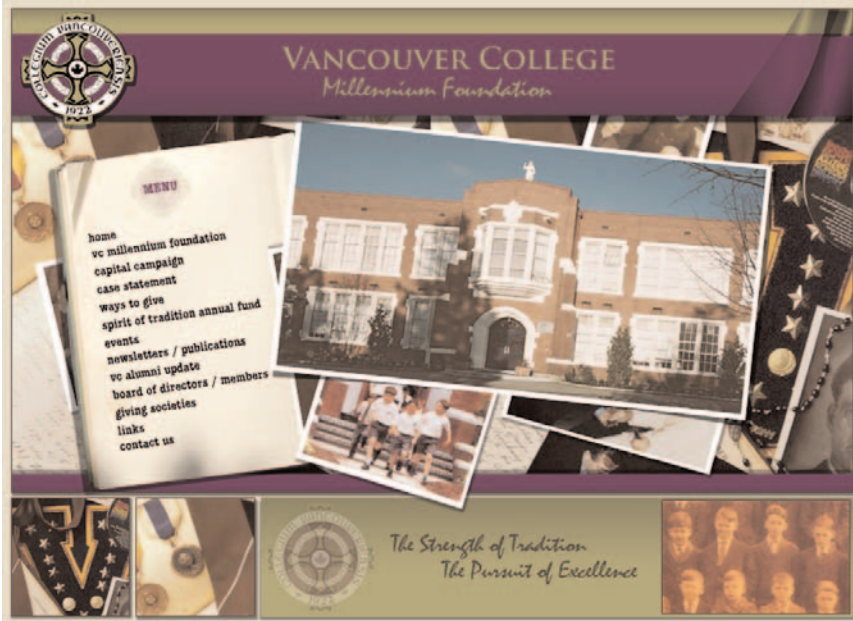
